The Society was founded in 1969, making us one of the oldest Family History Societies in the country. The Society covers the whole of the ancient county of Cheshire, and we have over 3000 members in Britain and all over the world. We are dedicated to helping people world-wide with Cheshire ancestry, as well as helping local people to further their genealogical research anywhere. The Society offers a wide range of services and facilities to members including:

- A free quarterly journal, CHESHIRE ANCESTOR, which includes articles, Society notices, members' surname interests, news of forthcoming events, group reports and programmes, including Net That Serf, a section covering use of computers in family history generally and Cheshire in particular".
- There are sixteen Groups of the Society, each of which arranges its own programme
 of meetings and activities. Members can affiliate themselves to any one group of their
 choice, but are entitled to attend the meetings of any other group in the county. We
 also organise conferences, library days and open days for all members at various venues throughout Cheshire.
- The Computer Club offers help to members with all levels of experience in family history and computing.
- Our Research Centre and main Library is based at Mobberley. There is also a research unit at Crewe Library. Both are open to all members of the Society. Between them they house several thousand books, magazines and exchange journals from other family history societies, an extensive Microfiche Library, which includes a set of G.R.O. indexes of births, marriages and deaths in England and Wales (1837-1960); also many films of Cheshire Parish Registers and Bishop's Transcripts. There are numerous CDs including the 1881 census for England, Wales and Scotland, 1851 census for Cheshire, Cheshire Marriage Index, National Burial Index and Family Search.
- Members living in the U.K. may borrow some microfiche through their local group.
 Most of the Groups have smaller libraries of their own, which often contain books of a more local nature.
